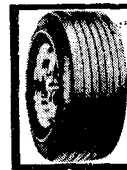

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POST IN YOUR CABIN

HINTS FOR WATER CONSERVATION:

- 1- Place two or three bricks in the tank of the toilet so that less water will be used each time .
- 2- It really isn't necessary to flush toilet each time it is used particularly during the nite hours.
- 3- If you are fortunate enough to have the old-fashioned "Chick Sales" install your old Sears catalogue and establish a reading room.
- 4- Don't run faucet to get hot water, use the Tea-Kettle and give Trico a little business, to make your hot water for tea or coffee.
- 5- Stack your dishes and do them once a day, remember you came to the cabin for a change and not to be a slave to the kitchen.
- 6- PLEASE TURN OFF, AT YOUR VALVE, THE WATER WHEN YOU LEAVE YOUR CABIN FOR MORE THAN 24 HOURS.
- 7- If you see water running from some other cabin shut it off if you can or notify Mr. Evans, Mr. Firth or any member of the Board.
- 8- Watering of trees, vegetable gardens etc is strictly forbidden as well as washing of cars. Water is to be used for human consumption and normal cabin occupancy. Any violations will be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors for appropriate action.
- 9- ANY MEMBER WHO IS RENTING A CABIN EITHER ON A SEASONAL BASIS OR YEAR AROUND WILL BE BILLED FOR THE WATER AND NO COLLECTIONS WILL BE MADE FROM THE TENANT BY THE COMPANY. IF BILL IS NOT PAID THEN SERVICE WILL BE TERMINATED. OWNER OF CABIN IS RESPONSIBLE FOR WATER AND ANY EXCESSIVE LOSS REGARDLESS OF WHO IS OCCUPYING THE CABIN.
- 10- Anyone desiring winter water in the future who has not had same in the past should notify the company so that an inspection can be conducted prior to the winter season.

The Law of the State of Arizona states the following:

- 1- Not less than three days notice must be given in person or writing, at the Company's office, to discontinue service or change occupancy.
- 2- The outgoing party shall be responsible for all water consumed up to the time of departure or the time specified for departure , which-ever period is longest.
