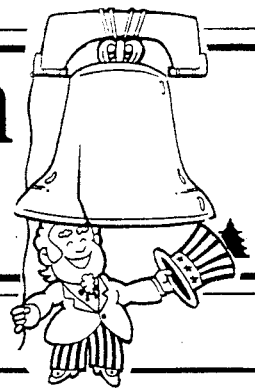

Water Co-op struggles with full agenda

The past year has been one wherein finances have dictated no improvements to the water system and only the most necessary of maintenance.

Miner's Ridge tank, a major storage tank, must be coated soon or it will be unable to be used.

The Safe Water Drinking Act means more tests on a much more frequent basis. A filtration system is in our future due to the results of these tests.

The January floods damaged parts of the system. Thankfully grant monies were found to defray a large portion of repairs, most yet to be accomplished.

Costs of labor and services continue to rise; our monthly bookkeeping bill has doubled this year. This is the first increase in several years.

And, since this is a Cooperative, it

Fran Odum, wildlife pastelist to be feature at ...and Other Treats Gallery show

Saturday, June 26 kicks off the second art show this season with a 6:30 p.m. reception to meet the artist.

Born and educated in France, Fran Odum attended the Ecole Des Beaux Arts in the south of France and while there, received a classical art background. In 1958 she came to the U.S. and settled in the midwest. But, it was 10 years later, after a move to Arizona, that she began applying her keen sense of observation to the pastel and watercolor wildlife painting that have become so popular. Fran's painting style enhances the simple beauty of nature and showcases her acute sensitivity to her environment.

She is a full member of the Pastel Society of America and won the prestigious Columbus Citizen Award at the PSA 10th annual exhibit at the National Arts Club in New York.

Fran has published numerous Limited Editions of her wildlife pastel paintings, and she is one of the artists featured in the Wildlife Art News 1988-1989 and 1991-1992 International Artists Profile Yearbook. Fran's award winning work has also been exhibited with the Los Angeles Audubon Society, Duck Unlimited, Pastel Society of the West Coast, Safari Club International and the Catharine Lorillard Wolfe Art Club to name just a few National, Regional and Local shows. In 1988, she accepted membership in the Catharine Lorillard Wolfe Art Club, and in 1989 won their Mary Hill Memorial award for pastel.

Fran makes her home in Tucson with her husband, watercolor artist and framer, Dave Craig. Weekends and vacations are spent in the field photographing and gathering research materials and information for Fran's future paintings.

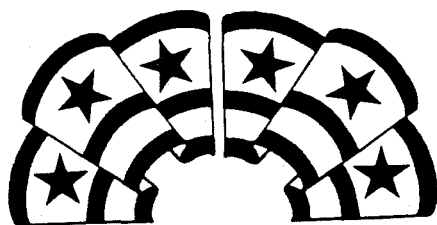

means that all of us will have to foot the bill. The request for rate increase that has been filed with the Corporation Commission is, unfortunately, only the beginning. We will still have to go out and borrow money just to address mandated expenses.

In the midst of all this, we continue to fight the battle for needed water rights and watershed management. On this front we have, with the grateful aid of the Mt. Lemmon Homeowner's Assn., have hired a very capable water attorney. While this is a long road and much work is still to be done, we feel a sense of some small accomplishment in reaching accord with the Forest Service regarding mutual goals for a total watershed management plan. The Instream Flow issue that you may have heard about is wrapped up in this area.

There have also been personnel changes that have not yet been fully resolved.

The new board has taken on a monumental task, but hopefully with the groundwork laid this past year, they will be able to address each issue as a

team and work toward a better future for your water cooperative. We hope that this coming year sees the possibility of becoming a water district revived.

Dear Homeowner:

Camping season is upon us on Mt. Lemmon. It's time to air out the houses and escape the desert heat. It's also the time the bears are out looking for food. The Arizona Game and Fish Department and the United States Forest Service want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable summer, free of bear interactions.

For the protection of public health, safety and property, the Forest Service has enacted special regulations on the forest. Although these do not effect private property owners, we offer them as only suggestions to assist you in protecting your property and the safety of your family and friends.

All garbage should be stored in bear-proof containers. Burying or scattering organic waste is not recommended.

Grills are another source of enticing odor and should be cleaned or removed after each use. All food should be stored inside the cabin, not in ice chests placed outside.

Black bears are extremely strong and persistent. Although they do not normally attack or threaten people, food will attract their interest and become their focus. Bears are active both day and night. If you should encounter a bear, throw objects, bang pots, yell or clap your hands in an attempt to frighten them away. Do not attempt to approach them, offer them food, tease them, or crowd them. You should inform your guests and cabin users about these suggestions. By working together, we hope to have a safe and enjoyable summer season.

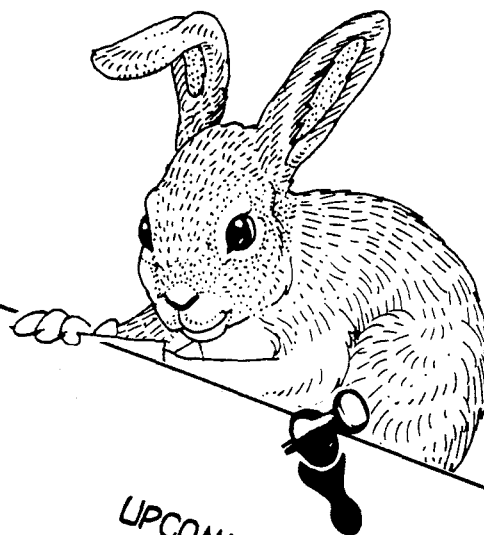
