

County regulates the installation of septic syson Mt. Lemmon. tems The State of Arizona publishes engineering quidelines which are considered by the County Health Officer approving septic system design. These guidelines, if followed to the letter, would make it difficult, if

septic systems past 15 years that I fire have been personally involved with Lemmon septic systems. the county health officer, recognizing this plight, has used good judgment in approving systems on Mt. Lemmon. I have always felt that part of the reason for this leniency is the requirement that Mt. Lemmon septic systems designed be bv licensed engineer.

We have been fortunate having the same in health officer for many years who had taken the trouble to understand the conditions on Mt. Lemmon and was comfortable in allowing deviations from the state quidelines. The fourth phase of the General Hitchcock g h W a Y Reconstruction Prowill commence sometime around January, 1996. The project will start at the Old Prison Site continue and for about 2.25 miles, ending just before
