FOREST SERVICE USER FEE STATION UPDATE

The latest word is that the Fee Station will not be up and operational until sometime in September.

The weekly \$10 fee will be

dropped until the start of the next calendar year, and the seasonal pass will be \$10 for the rest of this year. The \$5 daily pass will stay in effect.

All questions should be directed to Paula Huter, recreational staff officer with the U.S. Forest Service. The cost of the air conditioned fee station with bullet proofing, cell phones, cash registers, radios, incinerator toilet, bullet proofed enclosure and block walled generator and propane tank, signs, traffic counters embedded in the asphalt, solar powered street lights, etc

.... comes to a total of \$108,000. Of course that doesn't include the payroll for the federal employees manning the station. We

shouldn't worry about the set up cost - according to Forest Service spokeswoman Diane Maxwell in an article in the Tucson Daily Star dated July 20th, 1997 "the \$108,000 does not come out of the Coronado National Forest budget. The Washington D.C. office of the Forest Service is covering all costs." Of course we who have enjoyed the Coronado and other Forest Service areas are now being asked to pay "fees" to use these areas because the taxpayer dollars directed to the Forest Service are spent on 8x12 bullet proof user fee stations at \$108,000 a pop. Remember 50 areas were designated as user fee areas during the first phase of this "pilot program" by congress. When you do the math, remember to add in the cost of

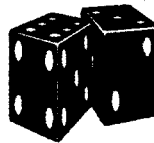

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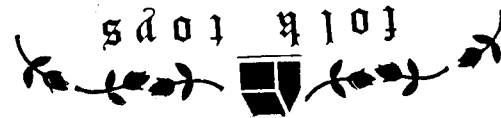

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This is to inform any interested parties that we are now accepting clients for our cabin security program. There will be various programs available beginning August 1, 1997. The programs are as follows:

THERE WILL BE A \$15.00 ONE TIME SIGN UP FEE (non refundable).

Twice a day checks \$50.00 per month or \$500.00 per year which = \$41.80 per month

Once per day checks \$45.00 per month or \$480.00 per year which = \$40.00 per month

Once per week check \$35.00 per month or \$370.00 per year which = \$30.00 per month

Twice monthly check \$20.00 per month or \$200.00 per year which = \$16.80 per month

Once per month check, \$15.00 per month or \$150.00 per year which = \$12.60 per month

A yearly contract equals the lower rate which can be paid yearly or with monthly installments. A yearly contract of at least daily security patrols is also considered by most insurance companies as equal to electronic surveillance and will result in reduced insurance rates.
