SOME LIKE IT HOT!

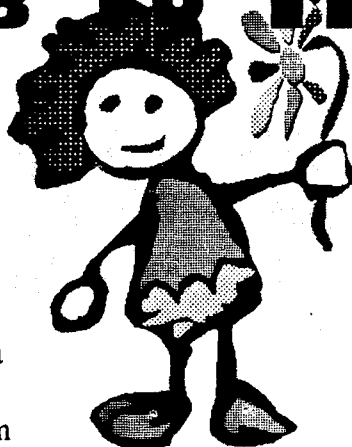

Come support the fire department on what promises to be a beautiful Saturday morning. For more information call Chief John Roads @ 576-1201.

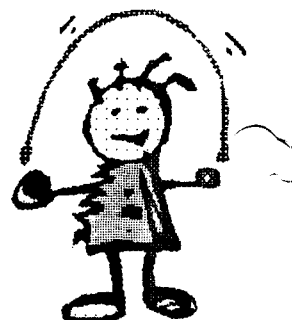
KIDS' CLUB To MEET AGAIN!

LEARN ABOUT THE FLORA AND FAUNA OF THE CATALINAS

The Mount Lemmon Volunteer Interpreters will host a series of nature walks every Wednesday in June, July, and August to introduce the public (novice and experts alike!) to the flora and fauna of the Santa Catalina Mountains.

Gather every Wednesday (or any Wednesday) at 8:00 am in the parking lot on the south side of the McDonalds at Tanque Verde and Catalina Highway. Or you can simply meet the group at Palasades Ranger Station (mile post 20) at 9:00 am.

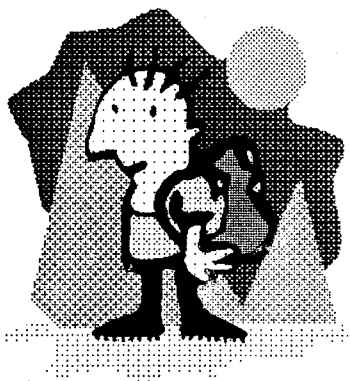
At Palisades the group will conduct a quick and lively Pow-Wow to reach a consensus on which trail to follow or what objective to pursue. This will vary from week to week. As the summer progresses we

will decide if we want to, for example, seek out the Red-faced Warbler, or the Western Bluebird, or the Zone-tailed Hawk. In the plant world we might elect to go in quest of the Cork Bark Fir, or the Claret Cup

Hedgehog Cactus, or Western Sneezeweed, or Spreading Dogbane. In the animal world we might well encounter the Tassel-eared Squirrel, or the Cliff Chipmunk, or the Mountain Vole, or Mount Lemmon's own special variety of the Horned Lizard. The range of possibilities is wide, challenging, and a never-ending source of facination.

Gear: hiking shoes and comfortable trail wear. In the rainy season bring a light rain jacket. Bring plenty of water

and a light lunch. If you have any questions or if you need more information call Bob Porter @ 326-4981.



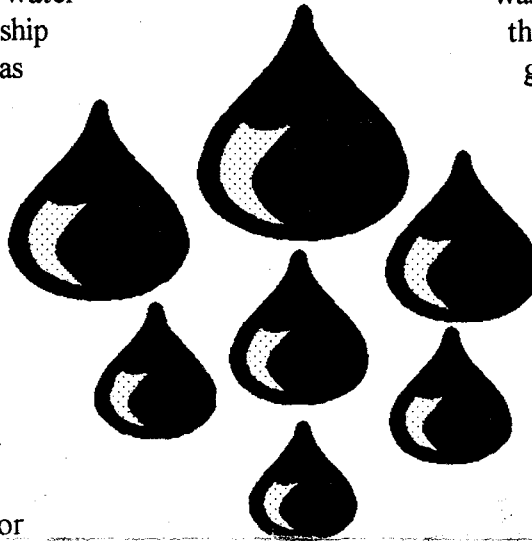
WATER COOP'S MEMORIAL DAY

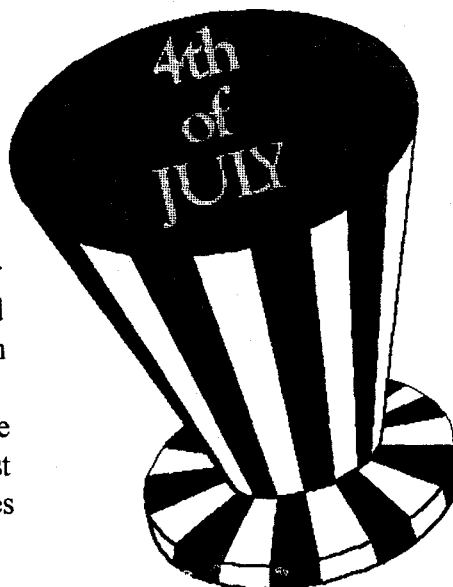
MT. LEMMON TRADITION!

Fran Zimmerman is the one to thank for this long standing tradition. This will be the 19th parade that she has organized!

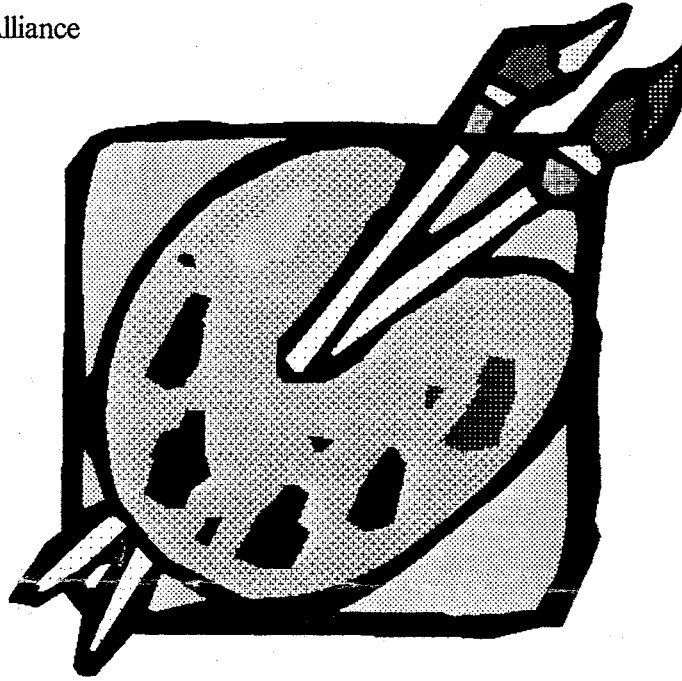

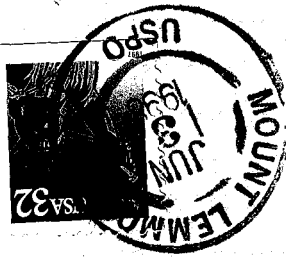
