this potluck we will bring back the Homemade Ice Cream Social. Years ago, we would have many homeowners make a container of homemade ice cream to sell for a nominal

amount after our potlucks. All proceeds went to the Firehouse for equipment they needed. We will do this again this year! Mike Stanley is the reigning ice cream maker and he tells me he has several new recipes for this year. (I think I've got a better one!) Making homemade ice cream is not difficult, and I urge you to practice before the event. If you don't already have an ice cream maker you can purchase one at Target, Ace Hardware, Wal-Mart or K-Mart. They run from \$17.99 at Target up to \$59.99 at Ace. These are electric machines and kids love to help. I personally have about 15 recipes for no-cooking ice-cream, but a basic ice cream mixture is:

6 eggs, beaten

1 Qt. half & half

2 cups sugar

3 to 4 Tablespoons Vanilla

1 can Eagle Brand Milk

Pinch salt

1 pint whipping cream

Add sugar to beaten eggs, mix. Add Eagle Brand, whipping cream and half & half. Then add vanilla and pinch of salt. Add Milk to the fill line on your freezer plus any well drained fruit and begin making a winner.

The Mt. Lemmon Homeowner's Association will provide a trophy for the popular favorite at this years potluck, so give it your best shot. Practice ahead of time if you can or just enter. Mike Stanley and I are available for pointers if you need them

Fred Pace and Bob Zimmerman met with Ray Carroll to explain our NeighborWise program and ask that Pima County help our program and FireWise the 51 acres of road easements. Ray was very impressed with NeighborWise and said he would seek support within the county, but reminded us of the current budget short fall. Fred and I also asked for a loan of a chipper, for county trucks going down empty to back haul slash, to waive dump fees for Mt. Lemmon residents, to station water trucks at the county yard, to widen Loma Linda Extension Road and to amend the current ordinances regarding trash/fire and health hazards to include properties located in urban interface areas.

An information letter announcing NeighborWise will be sent to all Mt. Lemmon property owners including a commitment/information post card. <u>The Section and NeighborWise</u> leaders need your responses.

The NeighborWise program, inaugurated at the annual Homeowners Dinner, was well received by all. Informational displays regarding FireWise were on display including the NeighborWise map showing how the deeded properties were assigned to neighborhoods. This map has also been posted at the Mt. Lemmon Fire Station. Please come by, find your neighborhood, and meet your on-duty firefighters!

The initial goals of the NeighborWise Leaders are to establish effective communication with all property owners and to assess the status, the needs, and the current activities of our FireWise Community. Sending in those post cards will help immensely.

A potluck dinner is scheduled for <u>Saturday</u>, <u>May 17th</u> at the Mount Lemmon fire station after the Basic Wildland for residents' class. This meeting is encouraged for all Section and Neighborhood Leaders, but all Mt. Lemmonites are invited. The focus will be on implementing the NeighborWise Program, which will include visiting demonstration areas and hands on training.



Water Co op

DWID PROGRESS REPORT

TRANSFERING THE WATER COOP FROM A CORPORATION TO A DOMESTIC WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (DWID)

The Water Coop has done a lot of foundation work to prepare for this transformation. The DWID subcommittee of the Water Coop Board of Directors has been working with the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) which is the agency that loans money to Arizona water companies like ours. We are determining the best way to sell the corporation to the DWID and to refinance the existing loans to get the lower interest rates. WIFA has been very supportive and we are close to determining the best way to achieve our goals.

The DWID can be formed, if 51% of the property owners sign a petition in support of the formation. On May 6 we will meet with the Pima County Improvement District Coordinator to discuss the details of the petition activity. The situation on the mountain is a little more complicated than normal because of the large number of properties owned by partnerships. It is very important that the petitions be signed exactly as the ownership is recorded in the county assessor's records.

The schedule for the activities that property owners will see starts with the Annual Meeting of the Water Coop which is scheduled for 9:00AM, Saturday, June 21 at the Mt. Lemmon Fire Department. Coop customers will receive the official notice of that meeting about a month before. At the meeting there will be a resolution to sell the Co-op to the DWID once it is formed, which will be voted on by the Coop members.

If the members vote to proceed, the next week the petitions to form the DWID will be mailed to all property owners on the mountain. About the same time an information packet containing basic information, pros and cons, and questions and answers will also be mailed.

When the signed petitions are returned they will be verified by volunteers of the Coop. When we receive the required 51% of valid signed petitions, they will be submitted to the County Board of Supervisors. The Supervisors will then have a hearing on the DWID formation where all interested parties can be heard. If the results of the hearing are favorable, the Board will then form the DWID.

So, the most important event for the Coop members is the Annual Meeting on June 21 at the Mt. Lemmon Fire Department at 9:00AM. Please plan to attend if you can.
