Fire Hazards

Now for the scary stuff. Cheatgrass. We are repeating ourselves in an effort to get all members of the community involved because we think eradication of this threat is a really doable thing in Summerhaven. We distributed information at the Annual FireWise meeting on April 28th. If you were not able to attend, we have pictures and information on the website http://www.treesformtlemmon.org If you see cheatgrass on your property, pull it out, being careful to bag the plant and especially any seeds it may have. If the area involved is extensive, please inform Trees for Mt. Lemmon and we will either get volunteers to pull, or do chemical eradication treatments, whichever you prefer. In either case, please send an email to info@treesformtlemmon.org on where you found cheatgrass and what you did to eradicate it. Or tell a board member of T4ML when you see them. We will be following the incidence of cheatgrass on the mountain for the next few years. Please also remember to follow all the FireWise (http://cals.arizona.edu/firewise/) recommendations to keep fuels away from your property. Remove needles from your roofs and grounds. Eliminate ladder fuels. Don't plant close to structures.
