As we move into the typically driest months of the year and after the last of the winter snows have melted, it is a good idea to treat your trees and plants to a little extra water to keep them from drying out completely before the onset of the monsoon season.

The spring and summer of 2008 promises to be busy but exciting! We're ready to continue our program aimed at eradicating cheatgrass as it begins to emerge this season. As you may have read, this annual invasive grass becomes an extreme fire hazard as it dries in late spring. The goal of Trees for Mt. Lemmon is to identify its locations in and around the community and join forces with our neighbors and any interested visitors to eradicate as much of it as possible before it gets a stronghold.

Be sure to plan on attending the following events:

Saturday, April 5th 10:00 am – 2:00 pm Volunteers with the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum will be available at the Mt. Lemmon Community Center to answer your questions about cheatgrass and other invasive plants of the region. They will provide detailed information you can use to identify plants in our neighborhood, when you might start seeing them emerge, and the best way to dispose of the plant once it's been pulled.

Saturday, May 3rd will be a community-wide Cheatgrass Eradication Day. There will be much more information available as we approach this event.

Erosion Control and Management

The damage from recent flooding underscores the need to be mindful of the trees, shrubs and groundcovers we use on our properties. The more we can reintroduce native flora that was lost in the fire, the better protection we have against major erosion that has resulted from the Aspen fire. Below is a list, compiled by Lindy Brigham, of native plants that are available through a local nursery, Desert Survivors. You can visit their nursery at 1020 W. Starr Pass; phone number 791-9309.



MLHO

The Mt. Lemmon Homeowners' Association (MLHO) was formed in 1969 to protect the welfare of the Mt. Lemmon community and to be involved in all aspects of its improvement. The concerns of the organization are not limited to private property owners. Full membership with voting rights, is accorded to private owners and leased land holders upon payment of yearly dues. Being organized, having a legal fund and having active LOCAL voice participation enables the Association to accomplish most of its goals. Pima County has said the MLHO is the strongest and most respected homeowners' organization in the entire county. Dues are \$25 per year payable in Januarry. Renters and friends of the Mountain may obtain membership for \$20 a year. Membership fees are prorated quarterly. The Annual Dinner and Meeting is held each year on the first Tuesday after taxes.
