#### Project "SOS" Save Our Summerhaven

A capacity crowd of concerned property owners and panel participants attended the first "Save Our Summerhaven" symposium at the MLCC Saturday, February 23, 2018. Over 75 people listened, questioned, spoke and learned about the serious issues facing the mountain and plans for addressing them, beginning NOW. Chairman Jenni Zimmerman Bill Piawtkiewicz, Bob Zimmerman and Michael Stanley have thoughtfully prepared for this event for months, assembling a variety of experts to develop significant plans to "Save Our Summerhaven." Panel members included; State Senator Gail Griffin, District 14; Jeff Whitney, AZ Dept. of Forestry; Patrick Cavanaugh, Pima County; Kerwin Dewberry, USFS; Lucretia Free, Pima County, Steve Miranda, USFS; Beth Borozan, Chief of Staff for Supervisor Steve Christy; and Mount Lemmon's own; Bob Zimmerman, Mount Lemmon Reality and business owner; Jenni Zimmerman, co-chair and realtor; Steve Brigham, Loma Linda HOA president; Joe Gunia, MLFD Chief; Sally Crum, FireWise Committee chair, Larry Waldron, cell tower communications; Deputy Dave Conto, PC Sheriff.

Piawtkiewicz introduced the program with an excellent power point presentation showing pictures of our forest, "then and now" healthy-to-unhealthy forest over the past 100 years. Bob Zimmerman followed with the history of Summerhaven and the relationship with the Forest Service over the years, Bill Piawkiewicz discussed the stark facts of how the USFS has been faced with severe budget cuts and government rules and regulations, putting constraints on its ability to maintain healthy forests. We must get Congress to appropriate funds for thinning. We need to work together to improve relationships with all entities, to help the USFS manage the forests, not just fight fires!

Other panel members followed with concerns such as the extreme drought and fire danger and how to address solutions. Fire Chief Joe Gunia is working on fire risk lot assessments for property owners and proactively obtaining resources to fight fires. Critical areas of concern emphasized by Steve Brigham include the watershed, communication system, astronomy site and tourist destination. "We can't afford another catastrophic fire. The community must work together." Sally Crum emphasized the importance of the FireWise Committee and the need for property owners to be educated and understand that "It's not if, but when!" Cell service is critical to the safety and security of all who come to the mountain, and Larry Waldron discussed the current lack of coverage and what needs to be done. Deputy Dave addressed traffic and parking concerns, especially during "snow days" and holidays.

For the first time, these issues were able to be fully addressed by the representatives from the federal, state, county and local entities on the panel. They listened, understood, agreed and pledged to work with the community to help solve the myriad of problems, beginning right away. It will take the cooperation, dedication and perseverance, but working together, we can "Save Our Summerhaven!" Thanks to all who participated. #### **Slash Burning Until Restrictions**

MLFD is currently collecting slash to burn prior to the upcoming fire season. The MLFD is proud to provide the slash burning service to our residents. This service allows our community to remain FireWise. Unfortunately, when conditions become hotter and drier, it becomes unsafe for us to burn as the potential for spot fires becomes high. In addition, continuing to add to the pile when we cannot burn adds a potential hazard to any helicopter crews working on fire and medical calls. Once fire restrictions on the Coronado National Forest are in place, we will be unable to collect again until monsoons lift restrictions. It is recommended to check with the MLFD or the Coronado National Forest before you start your clean-up project to check on restriction status. If you do bring slash once the restrictions are in place we **WILL NOT** be able to accept it.

A few pointers on how to keep our program running smoothly:

- \*We burn mostly "slash". Slash is the branches that you trim from your trees, or those that are on the ground. These can be piled at the Fire Station helicopter landing zone (restrictions permitting). Please stop in at the Fire Station and a firefighter will assist you.
- \*We do burn pine needles. Your pine needles must be in paper garden bags (these can be purchased at your local hardware store). Please place bags at the designated pine needle area to the South of the burn pile (restrictions permitting). These are added to the pile after it is burning to ensure proper combustion. Please collect needles with a rake instead of a shovel. We have learned over the years of burning that dirt, still, doesn't burn.
- \*We do not accept "rounds". Rounds are the tree trunks from fallen trees. Although we accept the slash from fallen trees, the rounds take too long to burn and allow a greater opportunity for embers to spread fire to our hillside. Rounds are currently still allowed to be dropped at the intersection of Catalina Highway and Loma Linda Extension.
- \*We NEVER accept construction debris or furniture. The Environmental Protection Agency authorizes MLFD to burn natural vegetation only. Failure to comply on the community's part could result in fines and/or sanctions.

Once again, MLFD is proud to be able to provide a great service to our community by burning off slash and pine needles to keep our community FireWise.

Your FireWise Committee is hard at work, preparing FiewWise information and events for the community. You should have received our FireWise letter in the last week of February. We've created a monthly calendar of the things you can do to create defensible space around your property, as well as educational opportunities and fun community events. Become a part of the solution, because "It's not IF, but When" we have another forest fire.

FEBRUARY - Sign up for information and education through Listserv (announcements@mtlemmonhoa.org), MLHOA (see application here in the Echoes), and Nextdoor - to sign up, contact Doug Mance at dmancemtlemmon@comcast.et with your MOUNT LEMMON ADDRESS. Even if you have already signed up for Listserv, please do it again as we lost data and there is a chance you may not be on the list still.

MARCH- Contact Mount Lemmon Fire Dept at 576-1201 to arrange your <u>free</u> FireWise Home Assessment.

APRIL - VOLUNTEER - contact your neighbors and work together to protect and FireWise your property. Reduce fuel loads and remove flammables from around your cabin and lot.

MAY - You don't need to open your cabin if you're not ready, but DO spend a day or weekend Fire-Wising. We are developing a list of providers who will be available for trimming, raking and cleaning your lot. If you don't have time, or can't do the work yourself, they can do it for you.

SAVE THE DATE - FIREWISE BLOCK PARTY- MAY 26, 2018. Watch for information about Wildfire Community Preparedness Day, Saturday May 5th. We are investigating the possibility of bringing in a crew to trim and chip the slash for your FireWise efforts.
