



About your Mt. Lemmon Homeowner's Association

Mt. Lemmon Homeowner's Association (MLHOA) was formed in 1969 to protect the welfare of the Mt. Lemmon community and to be involved in all aspects of its improvement. The concerns of the organization are not limited to private property owners, but the mountain community in general. Full membership with voting rights is accorded to private owners and leased land holders upon payment of yearly dues; renters and friends of the mountain can be non-voting members. Being organized, having a legal fund and having active local voice participation enables the Association to accomplish most of its goals. The Association organizes social events such as potlucks, pancake breakfasts, ice cream socials and raffles, enabling owners to mingle. The Annual Dinner and Meeting is traditionally held each year on the first Tuesday after taxes. Unfortunately, most of these events have been canceled this year due to the current health crisis.

Pima County has said the MLHOA is the strongest and most respected homeowner's organization in the entire county.




Pet food, treats and toys. Many residents have small pets! In the office at Catalina Village there is a Wish Tree for individual residents if you'd like to contribute.

Batteries Not Included

Living in Arizona, and specifically on Mount Lemmon, can present some difficulties. Excessive heat, persistent drought, water rationing, heavy monsoons, snow/ice and wildfires are just some of the natural challenges we face. In addition, we must be concerned with human factors like heavy traffic, dangerous drivers, parking issues, trash accumulation and careless discarding of flammable items. These challenges affect all our residents. One reprieve we receive for our trouble is the nonexistence of daylight savings time. Not resetting clocks or accidently oversleeping seems like one thing Arizonans definitely got correct. That is if you are looking at it through the lens of a citizen.

Firefighters in Arizona, however, are presented with a legitimate concern due to the lack of daylight savings time. Nationwide, firefighters have utilized this time as a public service reminder to change your smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector batteries. Granted, many new detectors come pre-equipped with 10-year batteries installed, but this is certainly not true regarding older models.

With daylight savings time set to expire on November 1, 2020, the Mount Lemmon Fire District would like to take this time to encourage you to change your batteries if you have older model detectors. According to the United States Fire Administration, it is recommended to change battery backups in hard-wired models at least once annually. It is also recommended that any smoke detector be completely replaced after 10 years of service.

Remember, most fires occur in the winter months when people are using fireplaces, furnaces, and space heaters to keep warm. Now is the perfect time to increase your safety margin by changing batteries in older models and making sure to test those with longer battery life. Also, Fire Prevention Week is October 4-10, 2020. This week is designed and dedicated to helping children and adults learn about fire safety and prevention. If you have children or grandchildren, especially, a link is provided below to help teach them about fire safety. There are a lot of great ideas for learning as well as valuable information for adults.

Additionally, we have learned from our Development Services team that the previously approved Verizon tower is currently in the design stage, and the project is expected to be completed in the Spring of 2021. Upon completion, the tower will bring improved cell service coverage for residents, visitors, and our vital first responders.




Our joint waterline project with the Fire District now has all approvals, and we are ready to put out for contractor bids. Our project engineer, WLB Group (Ed Roll and his very skilled associates) will have advertised by the time you read this and have tentatively set a 10/22/2020 deadline for all bids to be submitted.

With hotels, inns, our waterline connection to the MLFD and the USFS helipad, there certainly is dirt flying and new things happening on the mountain. Now let us see if the weather allows for the construction time that we all need to finish our respective pro-

jects.

As we move down the backside of our "season", please remember to insulate your meter boxes with pine needles in a bag, Styrofoam, or other suitable methods. Also be especially diligent in draining your waterline to your meter when you are away from your mountain home. It is good practice in the fall, but it prevents costly and inconvenient broken/frozen lines in the winter. Happy Autumn all. Enjoy your season and be safe and smart.


